2014 Nonpartisan Elections Calendar¹

November 10, 2013 – Sunday

60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE PETITION FILING DEADLINE

First day for nonpartisan prosecutor and judicial candidates, who want to file by petition and not pay a filing fee, to begin circulating petitions.

January 2, 2014 - Thursday

53 DAYS PRIOR TO BEGINNING OF PARTY FILING PERIOD

12:00 Noon – First day nonpartisan prosecutor and judicial candidates can file petitions for ballot access in the Nonpartisan Election without paying a filing fee. Political practices pledge to be filed with petition.

January 9, 2014 – Thursday

46 DAYS PRIOR TO BEGINNING OF PARTY FILING PERIOD

12:00 Noon – Deadline for nonpartisan prosecutor and judicial candidates to file petitions for ballot access in the Nonpartisan Election without paying a filing fee. Political practices pledge to be filed with petition.

January 13, 2014 – Monday

DEADLINE FOR NON-INCUMBENT NONPARTISAN CANDIDATES WHOSE NAMES HAVE BEEN PLACED ON THE BALLOT BY PETITION TO FILE STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTEREST FOR 2013

Non-incumbent candidates for District Court positions file with County Clerk. All other non-incumbent, nonpartisan candidates for Judicial or Prosecuting Attorney positions file with Secretary of State. (January 13 date included on Ethics Commission Calendar)

January 31, 2014 – Friday

DEADLINE FOR INCUMBENT OFFICEHOLDERS TO FILE STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTEREST FOR 2013

District Court Judges file with County Clerk. All other Nonpartisan Judges and Prosecuting Attorneys file with Secretary of State.

February 24, 2014 – Monday*

March 10, 2014 – Monday

DEADLINE FOR NON-INCUMBENT NONPARTISAN CANDIDATES WHOSE NAMES HAVE BEEN PLACED ON THE BALLOT BY PAYING A FILING FEE TO FILE STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTEREST FOR 2013

Non-incumbent candidates for District Court positions file with County Clerk. All other non-incumbent, nonpartisan candidates for Judicial or Prosecuting Attorney positions file with Secretary of State.

May 20, 2014 – Tuesday

PREFERENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION AND NONPARTISAN ELECTION

Polls open 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Petition Signatures

IF the nonpartisan candidate for a judicial or prosecuting attorney position chooses to file by petition, the number of petition signatures required will be the:

Supreme Court Position: Lessor of three percent (3%) of the number of qualified electors within the state casting votes in the Governor's race in the preceding election OR ten thousand (10,000) signatures.

Court of Appeals Position: Lessor of three percent (3%) of the number of qualified electors within the district casting votes in the Governor's race in the preceding election OR two thousand (2,000) signatures.

Circuit Court Position: Lessor of three percent (3%) of the number of qualified electors within the district casting votes in the Governor's race in the preceding election OR two thousand (2,000) signatures.

District Court Position: Lessor of one percent (1%) of the number of qualified electors within the district casting votes in the Governor's race in the preceding election OR two thousand (2,000) signatures.

Prosecuting Attorney Position: Lessor of three percent (3%) of the number of qualified electors within the district casting votes in the Governor's race in the preceding election OR two thousand (2,000) signatures. See Act 1110 of 2013.

Nonpartisan candidates can begin circulating petitions on Sunday, November 10, 2013. Petitions must be turned into the Secretary of State's Office between 12 noon on Thursday, January 2, 2014 and 12 noon Thursday, January 9, 2014. When the candidate submits petitions, he or she will complete all of their required paperwork, including their Political Practices Pledge. Their photograph will be taken for posting on the SOS website.

If the candidate submits a sufficient number of signatures, he or she will NOT need to return to the Capitol during filing season. If the candidate fails to submit a sufficient number of signatures, he or she will be notified prior to the beginning of filing season and will have the opportunity to file for office by paying the filing fee.

Filing Fees

IF the candidate for a nonpartisan judicial or prosecutor position chooses not to collect petition signatures and instead chooses to pay the filing fee for the position, he or she will need to file for office between Monday, February 24 at 3 p.m. and Monday, March 3, 2014 at 3 p.m. The dates for the filing period are the same as the dates for the party filing period, but the times are a little different. Instead of noon, nonpartisan candidates begin and end at 3 p.m. The major difference between filing as a party candidate and a nonpartisan candidate is that filing fees are made payable to the Secretary of State instead of the political party.

The State Board of Election Commissioners established the filing fees for nonpartisan offices. The filing fee for prosecuting attorney shall be three percent (3%) of the annual salary.

- The filing fee for the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall be 6% of the annual salary. (\$9,600)
- The filing fee for Associate Justice of the Supreme Court shall be 6% of the annual salary. (\$8,886)
- The filing fee for Judge of the Court of Appeals shall be 5% of the annual salary. (\$7,177)
- The filing fee for circuit judge shall be 4% of the annual salary. (\$5,559)
- The filing fee for district judge shall be 3% of the annual salary. (State District Judges - \$3,728) (The filing fees for the Local District Judges which are up for election in 2014, are listed on the attached sheets, next to the number of required petition signatures.)
- The filing fee for prosecuting attorney shall be 3% of the annual salary. (Division A - \$3,658; Division B - \$3,061)

Filing Fees will be paid to the Secretary of State when the candidate files for office. The first \$100,000 in filing fees for prosecuting attorney positions will be deposited into the Trial Court Administrative Assistant Fund. Any remaining filing fees from prosecutor candidates and all filing fees from nonpartisan judicial candidates will be deposited into the Nonpartisan Judicial Filing Fee Fund to be used by the State Board of Election Commissioners to cover the cost of election expenses.
