

2001 Profile

Changing Boundaries

2001 was a remarkable year not only in the Voter Services Department, but in the Office of the Secretary of State as a whole. Secretary Priest not only served as President of NASS (National Association of Secretaries of State), but also hosted the association's summer meeting in Little Rock.

Through the diverse operations of each Secretary of State's office, Arkansas was privileged to learn and share information for:

- ☞ Redistricting, Reapportionment and 2000 Census Data
- ☞ Funding for Election Reform
- ☞ Monitoring Overseas Elections
- ☞ Internet Regulations and Security
- ☞ Voting Technologies and Uniform Voting
- ☞ Voting Rights, Equal Protection, and Election Reform

Secretary Priest made several trips to Washington to testify in election hearings. On the local level, she responded to citizen requests for "secrecy of the ballot" by working with legislators to place a Constitutional Amendment on the 2002 ballot.

Additionally, voter education programs were conducted as were youth outreach programs. Technology was improved by upgrading the operating system to Windows 2000. Four (4) counties (Pulaski, Garland, Benton and Washington) were placed on an SQL format which is a larger data base capacity for the more populous counties. In partnership with the Information Network of Arkansas, online election night reporting was a successful venture.

Arkansas' boundaries changed in many ways during 2001 through continued aggressive leadership into difficult areas and a continued commitment to improving the choices of Arkansas voters.

Technology

Changing Boundaries

Election night reporting continued to enhance "quick/live" results from the county clerks who reported results directly to a public site on the web. This Secretary of State Voter Services and Information Network of Arkansas partnered project was used successfully for all the special elections held in 2001. The program was expanded to accommodate 2001 legislation requiring the reporting and certifying of: ballots printed and delivered to the polls, challenged ballots that were disqualified, spoiled ballots, unused ballots and over/under votes. Those election results, along with prior election results, are available for download from the Secretary of State's website at www.sosweb.state.ar.us.

The Secretary of State provides quality technical support for each county through a Help Desk that can quickly resolve problems as they occur. The upgrading of the operating system to Windows 2000 improved technology during 2001.

A redistricting manual was developed in order to ready the voter database for apportionment changes. The manual assists clerks in the process of changing registrants to new precincts and/or districts. Districts must be redrawn at least every ten (10) years to reflect changes in population as indicated by the U.S. Census. Understanding the relationship between a voter's address and the districts for that address is important to keep the voter system functioning correctly and to properly place existing voters as well as new registrants.

Secretary Priest continues to seek out and evaluate technological alternatives that may improve the voter registration and election processes.

Changing Boundaries

The Talk Back...Vote! project launched in 1999 gives young voters straightforward information about the election process and listens to the voices of youth. Secretary Priest and Voter Services staff visited high schools, technical schools, and colleges encouraging voter registration and participation in the election process throughout the year. The program has reached many young voters in Arkansas as Secretary Priest reaches out to explain the importance of voting and civic responsibility. The website at www.talkbackvote.org invites discussions, opens chats, gives information on how to contact your lawmakers and links to other informative websites.

Vote Notes is a guide to the election process in Arkansas covering everything from registration to frequently asked questions concerning the process. Vote Notes also includes a directory of Arkansas' 75 County Clerks. The publication has been widely distributed and is available as is other voter and election outreach information at www.sosweb.state.ar.us.

Because voting essentially begins with registration, Secretary Priest has eliminated many boundaries and made both herself and her staff available to all who need information, education, or simply a registration form in an effort to increase awareness and interest. Voter's Choice is another way boundaries are eliminated by disseminating statistics to the public.

The Effects of Changing Boundaries

Public Law 94-171, enacted in 1975, directs the Census Bureau to provide redistricting data needed by the states for redrawing districts of the United States Congress and state legislatures.

Once the census has been completed (every ten years), population figures are submitted to each State. In Arkansas, a board known as "The Board of Apportionment" consisting of the Governor (chairman), the Secretary of State and the Attorney General, has the duty of apportionment of representatives based on the population figures. Boundaries for both the House of Representatives and Senate districts change when there are population shifts.

The County Board of Election Commissioners in each county is responsible for the apportionment of the county into quorum court districts. Apportionments are based on the population of the county as of the last federal decennial census. The number of districts apportioned are equal to the number to which the county is entitled. Representatives for Quorum Court Districts are Justices of the Peace.

Once all boundary lines have been drawn at all levels, the result is a voting precinct/area having the same electoral criteria which creates a ballot style. A Voter's address determines the "Voter's Choice" of representation for:

- ~ *Congressional District*
- ~ *State House District*
- ~ *State Senate District*
- ~ *Judicial District*
- ~ *County*
- ~ *County Township*
- ~ *County Quorum Court District*
- ~ *Municipality (ward)*
- ~ *School District (zone)*

Much of the year in the Voter Services Department of the Secretary of State's Office was spent implementing, planning, and assisting with the changing of boundaries in 2001.

Congressional Districts

Changing Boundaries

Arkansas has four (4) Congressional Districts. The county composition can change when census figures indicate a shift in population affecting the "substantially equal population" compliance with the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States. Districts must be drawn at least every ten (10) years to reflect changes in population as indicated by the U.S. Census. The 2000 census figures for Arkansas indicated shifts in population which required the 83rd General Assembly to pass legislation in the 2001 session (Act 1840) which changed the Congressional District boundaries. Four of the seventy-five counties changed Congressional Districts: Baxter County moved from the 3rd to the 1st Congressional District; Logan, Polk and Scott counties were added to the 4th Congressional District from the 3rd Congressional District.






