

Post-Visit: Architects of the Neo-Classical Capitol ~ Word Search

It took sixteen years from 1899 to 1915 and two architects to complete the Arkansas State Capitol. Built in a neo-classical art deco 20th century style. After reading about each architect, use the **bold words** to complete the word search.

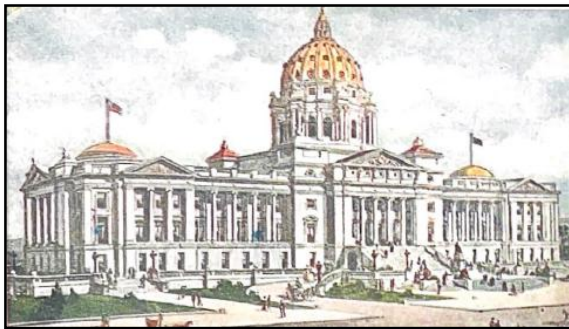


Caricature of George R. Mann, From Men of Affairs. Courtesy of the Arkansas State Archives

George Mann

From Indiana, studied architecture at (MIT) the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and graduated in 1876. In 1899, Mann read about Arkansas building a **new capitol**. He contacted (22nd elected) Governor Daniel Jones, with his plans and **blueprints** for a New Capitol. His plans were

approved by the legislators of the General Assembly in 1901. Mann's blueprints showed an ornate **Beaux-Arts** style, a French **neoclassicism**, which incorporates Renaissance and Baroque elements, and uses modern materials, such as iron, glass, plasterwork, cement and tile floors. Mann had many rivals, one of which was George Donaghey, a **contractor** from Little Rock, who felt the building was not being constructed properly. From 1901-1903 the capitol sat ideal for 2-years, with the public calling the project a lemon. Mann resigned as **Architect** in 1908.

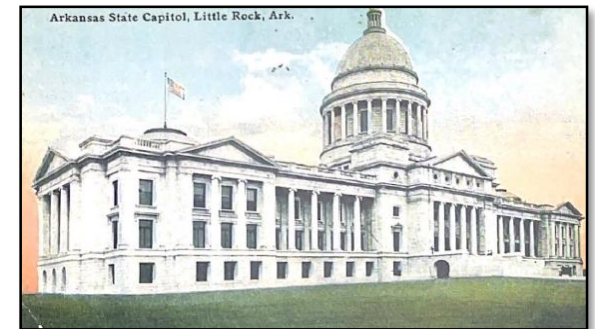

Cass Gilbert

From Ohio, also studied architecture from (MIT) and graduates in 1878. Gilbert designed a number of **landmarks**, including the Wall Street Building, West Virginia and Minnesota State Capitol. Gilbert was once considered the most famous American architect of the time.

When Mann resigned from the Capitol project, Gorge Donaghey, now Governor contacted Cass Gilbert in 1909 to meet with the **General Assembly** and inspecting the "**unfinished**" capitol. After accepting the job as architect, he called for the **destruction** of most of Mann features and details. Gilbert in 1910 **designed** the (6) 10-foot-tall bronze doors the grand staircases lined with **marble** and installed doric, ionic (*fluted*), Corinthian marble **columns**, and used an Italian art form called "Scagliola." In 1915 (24th elected) Governor George Hays informed the Legislatures the capitol was "**complete**."

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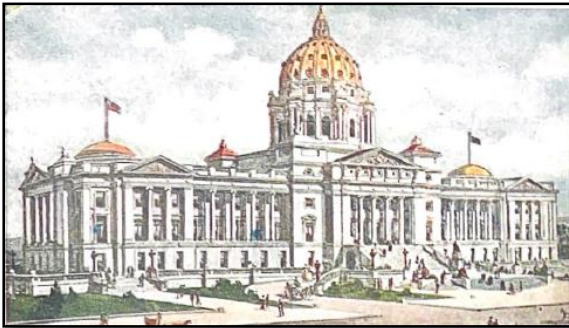

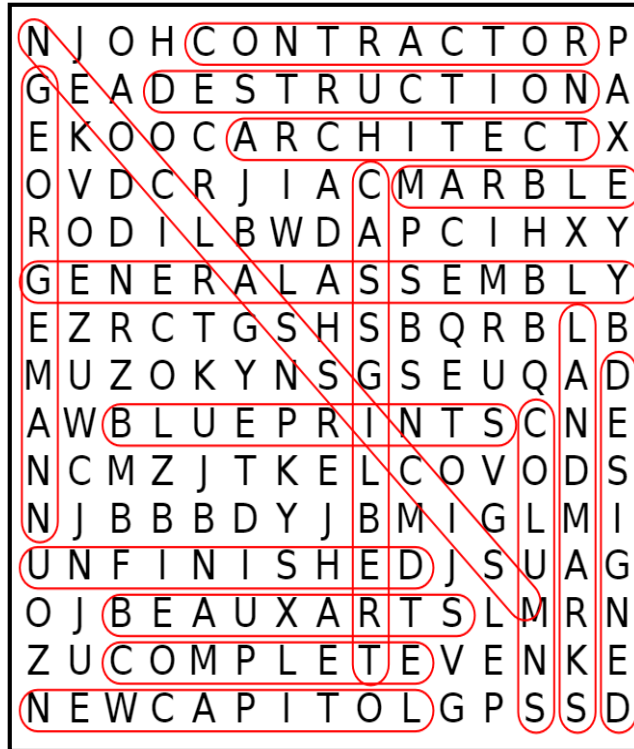
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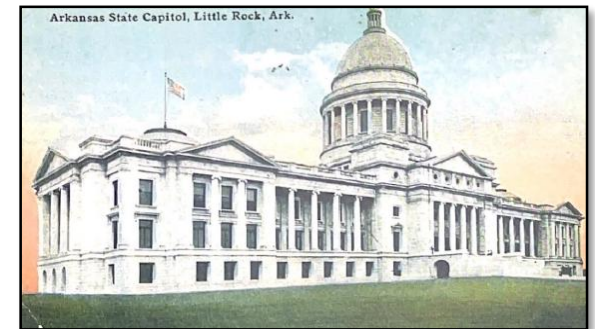
