

“Section 11. In all suits instituted under this Act to forfeit the charter of corporations, or to forfeit the right of a corporation to do business in this State, where a judgment of forfeiture is obtained and the cause is not appealed to the Supreme Court, the circuit court rendering such judgment shall allow the Attorney General his actual expenses, to be paid out of the assets of said corporation. All actions authorized and brought under this Act shall have precedence on motion of the Attorney General, of all other business, civil and criminal, except criminal cases where the defendants are in jail.”

ACT 162.

AN ACT to appropriate money to pay deficiencies for maintaining the State Capitol building, to maintain the same for the ensuing two years, to carry forward the work on said building and grounds, if any, and for other purposes.

SECTION

1. Appropriates money to pay deficiencies for maintaining State Capitol building, etc.
2. Duties of Board of Capitol Commissioners.
3. Laws in conflict repealed; emergency clause; Act in force from passage.

SECTION 1. That the following named sums be, and the same are hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the State treasury to the credit of the State Capitol fund, and not otherwise appropriated, for the following purposes:

Item 2. For water connections, salary and expense of commission, attorney's fees for defending suits brought against com-	

mission by Caldwell & Drake, architect and superintendent, secretary of the commission and incidental expenses, twenty-seven thousand dollars..... 27,000.00

Provided, that in the event the commission shall be able to secure the services of a competent person who can perform the services of both engineer and secretary, the salary for the combined services shall not exceed the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per month.

Item 3. For additional electric wiring to complete the unfinished rooms, etc., fire hose and steamer connection, additional registers for ventilation of interior, twelve thousand and three hundred dollars\$ 12,300.00

Item 4. For additional heating apparatus to complete inside only, additional monitors, fresh air connections, etc., twenty-one thousand and five hundred dollars 21,500.00

Item 5. For heating and generating plant at foot of hill with piping and connections thereto, tunnels, etc., and equipment and boilers, engines, etc., immediately necessary, with provisions for future additions, forty thousand dollars 40,000.00

SECTION 2. In the discharge of their duties hereunder, the Board of Capitol Commissioners shall let all contracts on competitive bids in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly, approved May 12, 1909, providing for the creation of said commission, and prescribing the duties thereof.

SECTION 3. All laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and this Act, being for the immediate

preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in force from and after its passage.

ACT 163.

AN ACT to permit any corporation which has been granted a franchise to erect a principal power dam across any navigable or nonnavigable stream in this State, to amend its survey, estimate an engineer's report, and to make changes in the location or plan of construction of its principal power dam, and otherwise, as may become necessary and advisable, and for other purposes.

SECTION

1. Power companies may file an amended survey with Railroad Commission, Secretary of State and county clerk.
2. Railroad Commission may permit said power company to amend its survey, etc.
3. Emergency clause; Act in force from passage.

SECTION 1. Any corporation which has been organized under the laws of this State for the purpose of producing power for manufacturing, lighting, reduction plants, public utilities, or other lawful purposes,
